
What is ESP?

ESP is a new qualification that certifies that students (15-19 years old) have completed a real entrepreneurship experience through a full-year in-school mini-company experience which has provided them with the necessary knowledge, skills and competences to start a business or to be successfully employed.



ESP is a high quality and complex learning path. You can change the life of these young people by offering them further opportunities!

How to get involved?



Engage your company through its human capital and expertise offering to coach or mentor mini-companies in any European country; sharing your special expertise through on-site or online presentations; joining the jury at a competition.
